During December, the airport's passengers reached 1.18 million, corresponding to an increase of 11.8% compared to prior-year levels. Domestic travellers enjoyed a 15.3% rise, while international passengers also grew strong at 9.7%. Foreign visitors enjoyed a robust rise of 22% and Greek travellers also presented growth at the level of 6%.

Overall, during the year 2015, the airport's traffic reached 18.1 million passengers, an all-time high record for the airport, surpassing prior-year levels by 19%, i.e. an additional 2.9 million passengers on a year-to-year basis. Both domestic and international passengers achieved record levels, reaching 6.4 million and 11.7 million, and achieving strong growth levels of 22.1% and 17.4% respectively. This growth was driven by both the foreign visitors' dynamic growth of 26%, as well as the Greek travellers' robust rise of 11%.
